An Update on St. Mary's Church from KF Local Church Council

Extensive surveys during 2024/25 have revealed that our C12th Grade II* listed Old Lady needs some comprehensive repairs. Urgent work to keep her watertight has recently been carried out, enabling planned services and events to continue. Financing this has hugely depleted reserves. However, that's only the beginning! Serious problems with the roof, tower, windows and Lady Chapel mean that an extensive programme

of works will be scheduled at an estimated cost of £104,642. Much of this cost, we anticipate, will be met through grant funding led by our Project manager, Stephen Hill. The Parish Council has already generously granted £5,000 towards developing the Lady Chapel into a hospitality area. So – watch this space – and, if you can, please support our future fundraising events!

Kirkby Fleetham Village Hall

Kirkby Fleetham Village Hall, situated next to the village green, is a superb facility much used by a variety of groups.

There is a schedule of regular events, which includes the popular “Hub” on Wednesday and Saturday mornings offering cakes, bacon butties and hot drinks, and Church coffee mornings which are held on the first Saturday of every month.

There is a full programme of exercise classes, plus Armchair Cinema nights, Bridge Club sessions, carpet bowls sound bath relaxation, and ballroom dancing. The Women’s Institute, Book Lovers, History and Gardening groups meet regularly, and new members are very welcome. The Hall also provides a venue for meetings by the Parish Council as well as the Feast, Village Hall, Gardening and Hub committees.

The Village Hall hosts one-off events, such as plays, talks, music evenings, race nights, bingo and pizza nights, and is used as a polling station during elections.

Facilities include a large hall with projector and sound equipment, a library which is also used for meetings, a well-equipped kitchen and the History & Resources Room. The latter routinely displays photographs and items on a variety of themes.

The Village Hall rooms are available to hire at a very reasonable cost, despite the increasing cost of maintaining the building and its facilities. There is also a selection of greetings cards on sale and there are two electric vehicle charging points in the car park.

A Mobile Post Office comes to the Hall car park on Wednesday mornings and a defibrillator is located on the front of the building.

The Village Hall Committee is a group of volunteers which meets regularly to manage the facility.

The Village Hall has continued to be heavily used over the summer and the committee has been busy ensuring the building and utilities remain well maintained. Much of the interior has been redecorated, the kitchen has been deep-cleaned and new tables have been bought for the Library. In addition, routine electrical and plumbing checks by local professionals have taken place. The History Group has created several fascinating displays over recent months, attracting many favourable comments, and film nights remain very popular with local residents.
