LOCAL HISTORY GROUP

Tuesday May 20, 7pm The Green Howards - Your local regiment

Simon Dowson, who served with the Green Howards from 1977-1985 will be talking about The Green Howards, Alexandra Princess of Wales's own Yorkshire Regiment, from its raising in 1688 to its amalgamation into the Royal Yorkshire Regiment in 2005.

Between 1877 and 1961 the focal point of the Green Howards, while their battalions served overseas, was their Regimental Recruit Training Depot at Richmond. Most of the recruits came from the surrounding local area and after basic training at Richmond were posted to the first or second battalions who could be anywhere in the world.

The strong local links that were created during the 88 years the Green Howards were in Richmond continue until the present day.


